

Territorial concentration trends

Territorial concentration of population

- Focus on western and northern Europe and metropoles
- Sub-urbanisation processes
- Challenges in shrinking regions and (inner peripheries)

Increasing concentration of economic activities

- Concentration of GDP growth metropoles
- Increasing social inequalities



Territorial concentration trends

Technology and innovation as potential game changer

- 4th industrial revolution accelerates territorial differences
- Urban areas in northwest Europe as innovation locations
- Circular economy innovation even more concentrated
- Decreasing agglomeration advantages & increasing sprawl



Territorial links and interdependencies

Flows to urban centres shape our daily routines

- SGI flows to regional centres
- Sharing economy, new types of flows mainly to cities

Flows to main hubs shape the boarder picture

- Knowledge, FDI, freight hubs, migration
- Labour migration 'soft flow back' dimension


Circular Economy



Place based circular economy

- Dramatic changes for all parts of Europe
- Disparities between strong socio-economic areas and lagging regions may decline
- Potential for small and medium-sized towns
- Challenges for sparsely populated areas
- Challenges for transport and material production hubs
- Potential for circular economy innovation centres









Possible Futures:

100% Renewable Energy



Fully renewable energy system

- Export potential for areas with renewable resources
- Ability to finance investments in energy infrastructure increases disparities within Europe
- Energy self-production benefits house owners outside central-city locations
- Increased costs transport costs challenge peripheries
- Impact on energy-intense industries reinforces divides





Territorial cooperation needs



Interdependencies of places shape Europe's development

- Cooperation is a must, not a luxury for all development themes
- European disintegration has no winners in Europe
- Challenges cannot be solved by territories individually
- Functional areas of different geographical size matter
 - Functional rural regions / Functional urban-rural partnerships / Cross-border regions / Transnational regions / macro-regions /Europe / Europe and its neighbourhoods



Functional urban/rural areas & cross-border regions

- Boosting renewable energy production and consumption
- Reaching critical mass for boosting the circular economy
- Transport services at the level of functional regions
- Integration of labour markets
- Strengthening the knowledge economy
- Enhancing productivity spill over of FDIs
- Provision of daily SGIs

Smart specialisation building on partnerships



Macro-regions / transnational regions

- Dealing with intra- and extra European migration
- Managing refugee flows across borders
- Cushioning centralisation in the knowledge economy
- Ensuring transmission infrastructure for renewable energy
- Reaching critical mass for boosting new technologies
- Provision of specialised SGIs, e.g. e-services
- Transnational ICT solutions

- Detailed analysis of territorial interdependencies at European level
- European cooperation patterns and network analysis for territorial development

Mainstream territorial cooperation
