

## City: Zaragoza (ES)

This series of fact sheets includes measures taken by the above-mentioned regional authorities during the first wave of the pandemic to strengthen public health security, adapt various aspects of city life to new reality, support vulnerable populations and support the local economy. The fact sheet has been prepared based on official sources and media reporting. 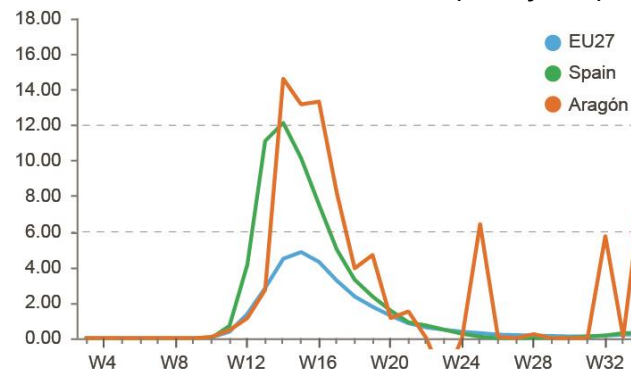
Measures described below have been taken by municipal authorities of Iași.

### Policy answers at local level - Measures<sup>ii</sup>

#### Health security

- Free public transport for auxiliary services & health personnel.
- Free parking spaces for workers of hospitals and clinics.
- Daily disinfection of all bizis (citybikes) and stations.
- Hydrogel dispensers in public transportation system.
- Mandatory use of face masks in public spaces.

#### Daily way of life and work

- Limitation of bus and tram capacity.
- Transforming various city streets on walking streets during weekends to facilitate social distancing  
+ All the streets of Zaragoza: limiting the maximum speed to 10 and 30 km/h.
- Adaptation of urban bus frequency.
- Refunded tickets in municipal theaters.

- Home delivery service for vulnerable people
- Food and water for elderly

#### Support to economic actors & recovery

- Shops, hotels and companies without activity during the state of alarm, are exempt from a series of local taxes.
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- The Zaragoza City Council is not going to initiate legal actions to regain possession of any of its municipal homes nor is it going to claim rents. It also suspends the aforementioned launches of

- municipal housing until the end of the state of alarm period.
- Extension of night tables and terraces 9-May MT/ LT
  - Initiative “We will return if you return”: visibility will be given to the shops of the city and the people behind it. Each business will design exclusive promotions and experiences that citizens can download to enjoy when the businesses reopen at the end of the lockdown. 9-May MT/ LT
  - Training: online courses that promote the digitization of small businesses. 1-Jul MT
