

Coal mining areas in CZ covered by RE:START strategy and TJTP

Karlovy Vary and Usti region in the northwest and Moravia-Silesia region in the northeast part of the country.



KVR – Karlovy Vary region

UR – Ústí region

MSR - Moravian-Silesian reg.

The different size of Czech coal regions – mostly **NUTS III** X NUTS II (only MSR)

Lignite surface mining X underground mining



Decarbonisation and coal phase-out in the Czech Republic

- Date of coal phase-out has not been settled yet
- Czech Coal Commission (CC) recommended 2038 (2033 is also discussed)
- Government assigned CC to further elaborate documentation that should work as a basis for its decision about the date of phase-out (end 2021)
- -> e.g. social & economic assessment, timeline for decommission of particular operations, proposals of legal instruments and scenarios of earlier phase-out

The expected end of coal mining:

- 2022 Moravian-Silesia region (MSR) 650 workers
- 2025-2030 Karlovy Vary region (KVR)
- After 2030? Ústí region (UR)





Economic challenges

- KVR & UR economically lagging behind other Czech regions (negative development trend) X MSR is recovering (positive development trend).
- the highest unemployment rate in CZ (5,6-5,7 %) all three regions
- Relative economic specialization could be challenging
- Sectors affected by transition (coal mining, energy sector and others)
- Lack of qualified people in the labour market and labour market mismatch

Social, socio-economic and demographic challenges

- brain drain (all regions)
- depopulation and aging of population (MSR, KVR)
- unfavourable educational structure of the population (UR and KVR)
- high level of executions and household indebtedness (UR, KVR)
- socially excluded localities and rising social inequalities (KVR,UR,+-MSR)
- low regional image and low attractiveness of regions (MSR, UK)
- quality of life
- regional identity historical context (German displacement, UR, KVR)
- space concentration of many problems on local level



Environmental challenges

- large post-mining areas for land reclamation and revitalisation (especiall in the Northewest),
- old environmental burdens and air polution problems (sign. improving).

RE:START strategy – Strategy for economic restructuring of the Usti, Moravian-Silesian and Karlovy Vary regions

- **2014** coal regions asked for government support to help strengthen their economies in the face of declining coal production.
- 2015-2016 regional analysis of the situation in coal regions (challenges and needs).
- **2017** The **RE:START Strategic Framework** (updated in 2020) type measures that recflect needs and challenges.
- **2018 Action plans** (2019, 2020, from 2021 two year period of AP)
- Action plan contains measures that are going to be implemented.





RE:START strategy:

- First stage (2015 2018)
 - → Emphasis on creating a system at central level with respect to the needs of regions.
- Second stage (2019-)
 - → Emphasis on effective absorption and implementation in regions.
- 2019 focus on the role of regions and its stakeholders
- strengthening the **executive teams of regions** and their **involvement in the preparation** and **implementation** of the RE: START **Action Plans**.



Strategic Framework of RE:START strategy – basic goals and pillars

Change of economic structure, faster economic growth and cease of regions lagging

RE:START strategy

- Strategy has no its own financial resource -> tool for government support from existing resources.
- **EU funds** –special treatment for coal regions within selected OPs ("extra points/bonuses in assesment")
- Realocation in favour of the coal regions in the last programming period (low emission public transport).
- Restart team initiator of national subsidy programs (e.g. on brownfields)
- Just Transition Mechanism and JTF new specific fin. resource for support of coal regions with their coal phase-out.



Just Transition process in the Czech Republic - preparation of Territorial Just Transition Plan and OP JT





Overview on Just Transition Mechanism in CZ

- Operational Programme Just Transition (OP JT) Ministry of Environment (MoE)
- Territorial Just Transition Plan (TJTP) Ministry of Regional Development (MoRD)
- RE:START department (MoRD) is assigned to elaboration of TJTP
- Coordination with regional partners is built on existing and parallel structure of
 RE:START strategy that was completed with new features such as Transformation
 Platform (TP). = consulting platform (4 meetings -> 5)
- "Top down" and "bottom up" approach use of umbrella organizations (32)
- TP representation of Regional Authorities and Stakeholders, Ministeries, Business, Key Industrial sectors, Employers, Unions, NGOes... many guests.




Participation and communication with reg. stakeholders

- updated websites (MoE, MoRD, regional governments), regional cooperation, workshops for differents stakeholders, consultations and interviews carried out by external consultancy
- **Series of workshops** done (February, May) municipalities, SMEs, educational sector universities
- Special seminar for NGOs (19 May)
- Participation in several events organized by external parties
- Activities carried out by regions promotion of Just Transition,





Structure and process of preparation of TJTP





OP Just Transition (MoE) – structure:

3 priorities = 3 regions

Each priority is divided into measures

Measures - 2 forms:

a) thematic

b) special



Structure of OP Just Transition - measures

Thematic measures

Thematic competitive/continuous • Territorial and networks solutions calls for proposals

- **Grant schemes**
 - » suitable for small-scale support

Special measures

- - » unclear under preparation
- Flagship projects (strategic projects)
 - Large p. stated in TJTP

Financial instruments - II. and III. pillar of JTM — ongoing discussion



Timeline

- First round of working groups under MoE September 2020
- 5/10/2020 start of **TA to TJTP consultancy services** (5 tasks, 9 month)
- 6/10/2020 first meeting of **Transformation platform**
- 15/10/2020 first draft of TJTP presented to CZ government
- 2/10/2020 first meeting of **preparatory team** (x executive team within MoRD)
- June/July 2021 Finalization of TJTP following by OP JT

Process of approval of TJTP:

-> SEA process -> approval by CZ government -> European Commission

2022 - start of OP JT
