José Manuel Simões



José Manuel Simões is Geographer and Urban Planner with a PhD and aggregation in Human Geography. Full Professor at IGOT-ULisboa – Institute of Geography and Spatial Planning of the University of Lisbon (since 2006). President of IGOT (since January 2019). Chairman of the Assembly / Council of IGOT-ULisboa (2009/2018). Member of the Executive Board of AUP – Associação Portuguesa de Urbanistas (2015/2017). Member of the Executive Board of IUPEA – International Urban Planning and Environment Association (since 2014). Member of the Council of National Representatives of AESOP – Association of European Schools of Planning (since 2016). National coordinator of the European project SECOA: Solutions for Environmental Contrasts in Coastal Areas (FP7; 2009/2013). Sector coordinator of the PNPOT – National Program for Spatial Planning Policy (DGOTDU-MAOTDR; 2003/2005).

Carlos Humberto de Carvalho



Carlos Humberto is currently First Secretary of the Lisbon Metropolitan Area. Assumes the presidency of the Municipality of Barreiro, on October 27, 2005 where it remained until October 22, 2017. He was President of the Lisbon Metropolitan Board (JML) from 2006 to 2013. As President of JML, he was President of the Regional Economy Commission, from 2006 to 2009, he was a member of the General Council of the Metropolitan Authority of Transportes de Lisboa, was an effective member of the Advisory Committee Strategic at POR Lisboa, he was an effective member of the Monitoring the Management Plan for the Tagus Estuary and the Assembly of the Lisbon Consumer Dispute Arbitration Center. In terms of international networks, as President of JML, he assumed the presidency of the Supervisory Board of EUROSPAN Portugal and was a member of the Board of Directors of AIVP (International Association of Cities and ports).

Piera Petruzzi



Piera Petruzzi is Senior Project Expert European Outreach and Targeted Analyses at the ESPON Egtc in Luxembourg since 2008. She is responsible for outreach strategy and Targeted Analyses on several topics, i.e. ageing population, digitalisation, metropolitan areas and cohesion policy, coordinating research teams and supporting stakeholders policy needs. Piera started her career in 1993 with the advertising agency Ata Tonic. She joined Cogest Italia in 1994 as Marketing and Communication Manager for shopping and leisure centers and launched the first Multiplex Cinemas in Italy in 1990. In 2001 she brought her expertise to Banca Monte Paschi Belgio – MPS Group in Brussels where she was responsible for coordinating a task force on new business and pr. She then worked as Marketing and Communication adviser of Publitimeanimazioni where she launched a business unit on public affairs. Shifting to the public sector in 2004, Piera worked at Basilicata Region where she was appointed as Communication Expert of programmes co-financed by the EU. Giancarlo Cotella is Associate Professor of spatial planning at Politecnico di Torino. His research focuses on the comparison of territorial governance and spatial planning systems in Europe and beyond and on the mutual influence between EU territorial governance and domestic territorial governance and spatial planning. More in particular, he explored the evolution and impact of the EU cohesion policy and related programmes and initiatives. He participated in several international research projects and published widely in the international literature. He took part to the recently concluded projects ESPON COMPASS, ESPON ReSSI, ESPON URRUC and ESPON SUPER.
