Overview

Purpose and flow of the event

The territorial dimension of the European regional competitiveness and the use of territorial evidence in relation to policy development are more and more important for regions and cities. The current Dutch Presidency of the Council of the EU highlights the importance of focusing on growth and jobs.

The seminar programme consists of a mix of high profile keynote presentations, themed sessions, panel discussions and a brainstorm. In this context the following themes will be taken up:

- Competitiveness of European regions: European regions plan a major role in economic development and the competitiveness of Europe, both in terms of private and public activities and investments. But how competitive are European regions? And what is important for a region to be competitive?
- <u>Impact of EU policy on national spatial planning</u>: EU policies have very often impacts on the ground and on the way societies operate which influences national territories, their regions and cities. What exactly is the impact of EU policy on national territorial development?
- <u>Policy focus on European territorial and urban development</u>: What is Europe discussing at the moment? And what new territorial evidence and data is needed to support this?
- <u>Urban Agenda for the EU</u>: A possibility to create a new form of multilevel and multistakeholder cooperation with the aim of strengthening the urban dimension in EU policy. How can the Urban Agenda contribute to the growth and jobs agenda?
- <u>Polycentric development at different scales</u>: Polycentricity is necessary to spread development opportunities across European cities and regions. But how and to what extent does polycentric development contribute to the competitiveness of European regions?
- <u>Cross border co-operation</u>: Cooperation across borders represents a possibility to create added value and integration by unleashing potentials on both sides of the border. But what are the obstacles that hinder cross border co-operation? And how can the obstacles be solved so that cross border co-operation can contribute more to competitiveness?
- <u>Bottom-up planning</u>: Planning processes are innovating in several Member States. The activation of civic society and the people on the ground is being implemented in order to give residents influence on their living conditions.
- <u>Territorial specificities</u>: Territories with geographical specificities are special. What is their current and possible future situation in relation to recent European policy developments?
- Get INSPIREd innovation in data and tooling: Geospatial data is a fundamental ingredient in almost all ESPON research initiatives. The INSPIRE infrastructure covers 34 themes that could be very useful in analysis on (trans)national and regional development policies. How can the ESPON 2020 Cooperation Programme make use of INSPIRE?

The Managing Authority will give some insight in the progress of the ESPON 2020 Cooperation Programme and the new ESPON activities will be presented clarifying their key policy questions and explaining how they will be addressed.

To round off, the ESPON EGTC will inform about the details of the implementation of the ESPON 2020 Single Operation. The Dutch EU Presidency will reflect upon the outcome of its term and the future two EU presidency countries will give an outlook on their ambitions.


