Background and objectives

A fast and successful recovery from the economic and financial crisis is at the core of all recent policy initiatives that set the framework for territorial development and EU cohesion policy.

The impacts resulting from the crisis are asymmetrical and diverse with (1) countries and regions that are not or hardly touched by the crisis at all, (2) others are hit harder but that seem to recover rather progressively and (3) regions that still suffer a lot from the crisis. The impact on poverty and exclusion are equally diverse.

Accessibility and territorial governance are seen as factors of growth and part of the solution of recovery. Will they allow regions and cities to generate solutions that bring growth and jobs to their territories? What role can they have in fostering greater resilience and greater social inclusion?

ESPON, the European Observation Network for Territorial Development and Cohesion, has produced territorial evidence on economic crisis impacts and resilience, poverty and social exclusion as well as innovative results to explain the role of accessibility and the efficiency of public institutions in designing and implementing successful development strategies and policies.

This workshop will debate the crucial question of what regions and cities can learn from other successful experiences to strengthen their position and improve their performance and thus reduce the risk for European citizens of being affected by poverty. It will be based on a mixture of presentations and case studies; researchers and policy makers will identify successful experiences or methods seen as a benchmark for other regions and highlight good practice aspects for potential transfer.
