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#### **CHALLENGES FOR RESILIENT PLACES**

Opportunity to address exposed social (welfare) and environmental (climate) vulnerabilities in regional recovery.

Increasing importance of monitoring and regional data collection





Deepening of existing territorial inequalities via uneven digital transition, disrupted investments, spatially blind recovery measures etc. Regional policy role in developing more balanced economies (incl. digital access, youth support, reskilling)

Re-evaluation of reliance on global value chains and re-industrialisation responses.

More complex, place-based and inclusive regional policy



Emerging disparities due to protracted recovery. Regional policy role in building resilience and economic diversification

Emerging opportunities related to advances in remote working

- Recognition of the development potential of **small and medium-sized towns** which can rebalance patterns of economic activity
- Responses go beyond solely investment objectives and strive for positive social and welfare outcomes

- Shift of focus from growth to development; from physical investments to reduced human footprint.
- BUT challenging to translate these strategic developments into practice.
- Small-scale adaptations of some existing schemes BUT more significant changes in discussion.

#### Development of an intermediate sub-regional level

- **Seventeen 'reference regions'**, with each Flemish province divided into 2-5 sub-regions;
- These will coordinate different sectoral policies and new and existing collaborations;
- Represent innovative consensus model
- new inter-municipal links stimulated by a subsidy (c. €900,000).

- As regional challenges become more complex ongoing need to improve effectiveness and efficiency
- Strategic changes aim to improve policy coherence and increase the visibility of regional policy objectives in other policies
- Institutional responses aim to provide competences at the 'right' spatial level(s)
- How to address administrative capacity deficits
