- how urban living and environments can assist and benefit the social integration and civic participation of older people within urban areas
- how to develop better methods for working with older people as key partners
- improved understanding of how to prevent social isolation in later life

- impact and potential (environmental, economic, social, governance improvement, etc.) of Urban Circular Collaborative Economy initiatives (UCCE)
- the correlation between multi-level policies (entrepreneurial, educational and training, urban planning, etc.) and the success or failure of UCCE initiatives
- correlation between cultural dimensions (power distance, masculinity-feminity, individualisticcollectivistic, etc.) and the success or failure of Urban Circular Collaborative Economy initiatives
