potential benefits are often set against the **costs** of coordination and the counter-benefits of autonomy and flexibility

Changing the mindset – effective and structured dialogue is needed between the the FP and MA people

Challenges

Different intervention logic of the programmes – H2020 based on S&T excellence while ESIF focuses on economic, social and territorial development

Different set of rules and regulations:

- State aid rules to be applied in programmes funded by ESIF
- H2020 exemption from State Aid
- Parallel use of funding difficult

H2020 – implemented mainly international consortia, monobeneficiary actions are limited

ESIF – mainly used at national level, limited support for international activities

EPIC – Centre of Excellence in Production Informatics and Control

- Centre of Excellence in Production Informatics and Control (EPIC) aims to create a centre of excellence with the potential to achieve remarkable results in the fields of cyber-physical production systems
- speed up innovation, create new industrial solutions, develop a sustainable and competitive production ecosystem, and "train" a generation of young researchers full of initiative and experienced in the use of international best practices.
- The project has a total budget of EUR 21.7 million (HUF 6.5 billion) supported from H2020, Structural Funds and national funds.
