### // Context and objectives

The ESPON week from 29 November to 2 December 2021 is organised in cooperation with the Slovenian Presidency of the EU Council in the framework of the ESPON 2020 Cooperation Programme, which aims to support policy development for promoting territorial cohesion and harmonious development of the European territory.

#### All events are taking place online.

The week addresses European, regional and local policymakers, as well as researchers, practitioners and experts.

One of the highlights of the week will be an introduction to the new ESPON 2030 Cooperation Programme and the official launch of the consultation process to define thematic priorities for future research activities by ESPON.

The discussion will revolve around the four following areas:

- Perspective for all people and places,
- Climate neutral territories,
- Governance of new geographies,
- Resilient places to crises.

During the meeting participants will learn more about the structure of the new programme and will actively contribute to shaping its main activities for the next few years.

The second key moment of the week is the ESPON Seminar, which aims at discussing "Quality of Life for territorial and citizen-centric policies" bringing together latest research on the topic and policy challenges.

Improving the Quality of Life is a key objective for policymakers at different scales, and it has become more relevant in the policy agenda along with increasing demands for the participation of citizens in the political process. But how can we measure quality of life and its impact on policymaking?

Until now, level of income and standard of living have been used to assess our personal success and Quality of Life. Yet, there is an ongoing discussion on how quality-of-life indicators can complement economic and social indicators to measure territorial development and link growth, prosperity and quality of life in a way that is reducing inequalities and harmful impacts on the environment.



The COVID-19 outbreak, underlined new, unprecedented challenges that affect directly our living conditions. The potential changes to our way of life are manifold, as this crisis has spared no territory and has had uneven impacts at global and local levels.

In this framework, the ESPON seminar brings together some of the most prominent organisations that are working on in Europe and combines them with insights from the latest ESPON studies that provide a newly developed methodology to assess QoL through a place-based and citizen-centric approach.

Among others, participants will also be offered during the week:

- a new release of TerritoriALL, the ESPON magazine, investigating the priorities of the Slovenian Presidency, latest ESPON research and an outlook on the future ESPON 2030 Cooperation Programme,
- A new policy brief summarizing ESPON research on "Quality of Life for territorial and citizencentric policies",
- A new Atlas featuring multiple indicators to depict quality of life in Slovenia and in neighbouring regions,
- and a series of online workshops to get to know more and discuss latest ESPON research.

# 14:00 – 15:15 Interregional relations in Europe: will the pandemic result in deeper interdependencies or in increased divergence between regions?

The COVID-19 pandemic has brought about a change in the way people live, work and travel. The closure of the EU's internal and external borders or other protective measures introduced by policymakers has affected cross-border mobility as well as cross-border (but not only) regions' societies and labour markets. Even though the EU external cross-border flows were in the past vulnerable to various political and economic factors (e.g. introducing a visa system, agreement on local cross-border traffic), only the pandemic showed how relevant are such measures for noticeable and broad change in international mobility. This session will present the first results of the ESPON applied research which aims at analysing interregional relations and investigate how interdependencies can be drivers for and/or barriers to the development of competitiveness and cohesion. The session will also provide the opportunity to present a new analysis of flows of goods, services, people, capital and knowledge between Slovenian regions and other European regions and discuss their possible consequences for renewed regional strategies in Slovenia.

# 15:15 – 16:30 Soft territorial cooperation: how mapshots can help policymakers? Inspiration from good practices in Lihuania, Greater Region and Alpine Region

In the Territorial Agenda adopted in December 2020, Member States commit themselves to take "engage with local and regional decision makers to strengthen cooperation on long-term place-based strategies and address sustainable functional links between neighbouring areas". Soft territorial cooperation can contribute to the promotion of the integrated multilevel governance approaches and mapshots are an important tool in this process, providing a synthetic representation of evidence, expert opinions and stakeholder perceptions. This session will show how regional and local policy makers, responsible for spatial planning in their regions, can be supported in reducing the GHG emissions. It will present and discuss the Greenhouse Gas Impact Assessment tool (GGIA tool), a tool developed by the QGasSP targeted analysis, to estimate the impacts of spatial plans on GHG emissions. The methodology integrated in the tool addresses land



use changes and changes in buildings, transport and electricity. The use of the tool will be illustrated and discussed during the workshop using examples of the four stakeholder regions behind the project.

### 11:00 – 12:15 Territorial indicators based on big data from private digital platforms

In March 2020 the European Commission reached a landmark agreement with Airbnb, Booking, Expedia Group and Tripadvisor on sharing tourism data. As the first incoming data is being published by Eurostat as experimental statistics, the workshop will deliberate on what kind of big data can be extracted from private digital platforms and where the challenge lies. In particular, the recent ESPON BIG data and territorial indicators project will be presented along with experiences from big data enthusiasts. The session will conclude with a reflection on how the ESPON programme could build a lasting cooperation with private digital platforms, allowing for big data sharing and extraction on a regular basis for the purpose of developing territorial indicators (which would be useful also for measuring quality of life).


