Results-Based Accountability (RBA)

- *a framework / a way of thinking that provides step-by-step methods that turn data into action
- starting with quality of life conditions (called "results")
- agencies and (cross-agency) partnerships identify indicators, produce baselines, consider best practice, and
- develop strategies, action plans and budgets that are then
- implemented, monitored and continuously improved

Population Accountability

about the well-being of

WHOLE POPULATIONS

Measuring the status of territories and populations

For Communities-Cities-Regions-Countries e.g. the population of Northwest Europe, of Estonia

Performance Accountability

about the well-being of

CUSTOMER/"Stakeholder" POPULATIONS

For Programmes–Agencies- and Service Systems e.g. the Interreg Northwest Europe Programme, the EU Strategy of the Baltic Sea Region

Accountability of a programme, organisation, institution

Measuring the performance of programmes and projects

Definitions

ESPON // ESPON seminar in Sofia

Results or Outcome

A condition of well-being for populations Prosperous Economy, Inclusive communities, Healthy Environment

Indicators or Benchmark

A measure which helps quantify the achievement of a result. Employment situation: Youth unemployment rate

Air quality: Concentration particulate matter

Performance measure

A system measure of how well a program, agency or service is working.

- 1. How much did we do?
- 2. How well did we do it?
- 3. Is anyone better off/ Has anything improved?


