Overview

Context

In the spirit of the original intention of the ESPON internal seminars, this seminar intends to stimulate the dialogue between the ESPON Monitoring Committee, the Stakeholders participating in the Targeted Analyses projects, the Transnational Project Groups and the network of ESPON Contact Points in order to strengthen the networking and contribute to in-depth discussions on the strategic relations between the ESPON results and policy development.

The seminar will be held in Liège, Belgium, on 17-18 November 2010.

It is organised in cooperation with the Belgian Presidency of the European Union within the framework of the ESPON 2013 Programme.

Scope

This ESPON internal seminar has its focus on new EU policy orientations and the added-value of ESPON results for cohesion policy development. The European policy development process is entering into an important phase defining the orientations for Structural Funds post 2013. The Europe 2020 Strategy is leading the way, territorial cohesion is a new aim for the European project.

The European Commission foresees prior to the seminar to publish the 5th Cohesion Report. The Territorial Agenda process is progressing on an updated Territorial Agenda by spring 2011. In support of these processes ESPON has published the 'First ESPON 2013 Synthesis Report – New Evidence on Smart, Sustainable and Inclusive Territories' of the Applied Research and Targeted Analyses by summer 2010.

Purpose

ESPON, the European Observation Network for Territorial Development and Cohesion, strives to support policy development in conjunction with the objective of territorial cohesion and harmonious development of the European territory.

The purpose of this ESPON seminar is in this context three-fold:

- Stimulating a lively discussion about project results and progress, highlighting the added value of using the facts and evidence provided in place-based policy making.
- Enlarging the involvement of the four groups of actors and support the networking between the project groups by crossing the research themes and creating synergetic linkages between the projects.
- Enhancing scientific and policy relevant output by exchanging good practices and advice as well as look for improvements in disseminating and communicating ESPON project results to policy makers ranging from local/regional level to pan-European level.

At the seminar you will be provided with a printed version of the First ESPON 2013 Synthesis Report and the Territorial Observation No. 3. 'Territorial Dynamics in Europe - Trends in Economic Performance of European Regions 2000-2006'. Also a 'Project Overview – Information on on-going and new projects within the ESPON 2013 Programme' will be distributed. This document gives a short overview of the thematic scope, main research areas and main results envisaged for all ESPON projects under Priority 1, 2, 3 and 4. Especially the information provided on the recent contracted projects might be of use in order to decide which workshop sessions could be of highest interest.

- How could future Structural Funds programmes become more evidence based in their implementation of strategy and projects?
- What approaches would be recommendable in order to contribute to the aims of smart, sustainable and inclusive growth and territorial cohesion?

Interactive Workshops of Applied Research (Priority 1) and Targeted Analyses (Priority2)

Focus: New EU policy orientations and the added-value of ESPON results for cohesion policy development.

The parallel interactive workshops will highlight key findings and conclusions of the ESPON Applied Research Projects and Targeted Analyses of relevance for policy makers and stakeholders. Thematically related projects will be "crossed" and presented jointly in the workshops. In this way, the workshops will convey the results of the Applied Research and Targeted Analyses projects in a shared forum. Some of the projects will present their final results, while for others it will be the first presentation at an ESPON seminar and therefore be a general introduction of the thematic scope and main results envisaged.

In the workshop sessions, the projects are invited to present their project / project results individually, and the following key questions are expected to be addressed:

- 1. Which new facts and results have the highest relevance for current policy development?
- 2. How and where can these new results be used in an operational way in support of the European 2020 strategic aims of smart, sustainable and inclusive growth and territorial cohesion?
- 3. Which strategic linkages can be identified between the projects presented in the workshop?

After the presentations of the projects the chair will summarize the identified linkages between the projects and invite the audience for a discussion addressing the following questions.

- 1. Are there any additional elements that should be considered by the projects in order to make the presented results even more operational to support the current policy development?
- 2. Are there additional linkages between the jointly presented projects that were not mentioned, which can give an added-value to the envisaged project results?

The sessions within the workshops for Priority 1 and 2 will be structured as follows (90 minutes):

- 5 min Introduction by the chair about the topic of workshop and the thematic relation between the projects to be presented
- 60 min Presentation of the project and Q&A (3 x 20 minutes)
- 5 min Summing up by the chair focusing on the linkages between projects
- 20 min Open discussion

Interactive Workshops of Scientific Platform (Priority 3)

The workshops on the Scientific Tools shall provide the participants with information on an efficient use of the extensive ESPON Database and indicators. The aim is to show, demonstrate and discuss the work so far done on the ESPON Database and the implications this has for the other ESPON projects as well as to present and discuss the INTERCO project on Indicators and Indices.

The first workshop of the ESPON Database is aiming to provide Lead and Project Partners that are new in the ESPON family with basic information on how the tool can be used in order to give added value to the Applied Research and Targeted Analyses projects. Furthermore, information on how data gained by the projects can be properly integrated in the Database will be provided. The workshop on the second day will introduce and explain to the audience new elements in the ESPON Database.


The INTERCO project sets out to identify suitable territorial cohesion indicators and indices. Their two workshops present work in progress of the project and provide the possibility for the ESPON community to contribute with their insights to the shaping of the work of the INTERCO project. The workshop on the first day is aiming to investigate measurable storylines for territorial cohesion. On the second day emphasis will be put on linking ESPON indicators to various dimensions of territorial cohesion.
