Workshop idea

- Build on general expectations to the Economic Recession, its further development and possible effects on regions and cities
- In parallel workshops deepen the understanding of the regional/local situation in different parts of Europe, through dialogue between policy makers and scientists
- Focus on
 - Likely diversity of effects on regions, cities and larger territories
 - Territorial potentials, opportunities and new avenues for development by looking at different ongoing themes of ESPON projects
- Conclude on possible development opportunities and possible strategies that could help counterbalancing the current economic situation.



Global economic recession related to regions/cities

- The economic recession is in development
- Facts broken down to regions/cities not yet available
- Informed guesses the best possible option
- Country and sector specific impacts
- Random territorial patterns of impacts
- Policy shifts expected supported by public investments and incentives that will have territorial effects
- Territorial impact may shift rapidly over coming months (and years)



Global recession and territorial vulnerability

- Regional/urban vulnerability and contraction/lay-off seems to depend on:
 - Vulnerability of the national economy
 - Vulnerability with particular high presence of sectors, such as:
 - Finance, banking sector
 - Manufacturing sector, particular the export oriented
 - Housing related sectors
 - Automotive industry and sub-suppliers
 - Tourism sector
 - Solidity of individual businesses



Changing Driving Forces

- Intensified global economic cooperation
- Lower growth rates the years ahead
- Substantial increase in unemployment
- Macro-economic policies determinant on domestic demand and revival of growth/releasing endogenous potential
- Strong reduction of FDI in short and medium term
- Development of green economy and energy
- Lower increase in transport flows
- Strong impacts of public investments in infrastructures
- Slower progress of fertility rates (in some countries)
- Legal migrants going back home and stronger pressure of illegal migrants
- Acceleration of climate change and intensification in prevention measures limiting greenhouse gas emissions



Key Workshop Questions

- -What main driving forces are emerging related to the global economic recession in the thematic field/types of territories addressed?
- –What are the main challenges and territorial development opportunities that could be considered in the light of the global economic recession?
- -Which considerations could be relevant for possible recovery strategies and shifts in policy priorities in order to counterbalance negative territorial patterns and development trends?



4 parallel Workshops

- Workshop A: Northern Europe
 Focus: Regional responses to demographic and energy challenges
- Workshop B: Southern Europe
 Focus: Economic growth factors and tools in support of regional policies
- Workshop C: Central and Eastern Europe
 Focus: Cross-border regions in relation to polycentric development
- Workshop D: Western Europe
 Focus: Agglomeration economies in city-regions and possible spill over effects to the wider regional economy
