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Territorial Agenda and Territorial State and Perspectives of the EU

- Agreed at the Informal ministerial meeting in Leipzig, May 2007
- Territorial Agenda (TA)
 – territorial priorities set for EU27
- Territorial State and Perspectives of the EU (TSP) – evidence base for policy making, relied dominantly on the available ESPON results





Territorial Agenda – priorities for EU27

Strengthening territorial cohesion, making better use of territorial diversity

- 1. Polycentric development and innovation
- 2. New forms of partnership and territorial governance in urban-rural relations
- 3. Regional clusters of competition and innovation
- 4. Strengthening and extension of Trans-European networks
- 5. Trans-European risk management, impacts of climate change
- Strengthening ecological structures and cultural resources





Territorial State and Perspectives of the EU in 2007 - TSP

- Evidence for policy making in field of
 - Growth and innovation
 - Transport and energy
 - Risk management
 - Environment, nature, culture
 - Territorial structures
 - demography, cohesion, urban and rural areas, potentials and challenges





Territorial Agenda – revision in 2011

- Explicitly stated in TA
- Responsible: Hungarian Presidency
- Working group with 16 partners
- Start of the work:
 - Are there new directions needed?
 - In which direction should priorities be changed?
 - What can affect new directions?
- Updating the TSP





Territorial Agenda revision – evidence to be updated

- What is the sufficient evidence for the revision of the TA?
 - Evidence-base:
 - ESPON
 - Cohesion Reports
 - Other methods without detailed information for the entire European space





What changes have occurred in the socioeconomic, environmental processes?


- Financial and economic crisis fundamental changes

- Enlargement


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




How will have territorial structure been changed by 2011?










Global financial and economic crisis

- Available ESPON findings and related existing priorities based on economic growth and convergence
- Uncertainty:
 - Extent of economic decline
 - Duration of economic decline
 - Territorial consequences of decline
- Themes related to economy and growth changed fundamentally











Enlargement and changing neighbourhood

- Enlargement in 2004 and 2007 new aspects not reflected entirely in analysis and policy making
- Western Balkans: potential member states "white hole" in maps
- Mediterranean North Africa
- External borders shifted to east
- Economic crisis: global ties in focus Europe in the World?
- Interdependence of regions within a global economy











Borders, border regions

- Border relations have changed rapidly and significantly what happened in old MSs in 50 years, happens in 5 years with enlargement
- Change in border relations changes territorial structures in socio-economic terms
- Effects of unequal macroeconomic policies greater significance
- Local initiatives have an important role
- Potentials for common action











EU regional policy 2007-2013

- Changes in eligibility
- New elements:
 - Territorial cooperation objective
 - EGTC
 - Instrument for Pre-Accession
 - Refundable support
- What are the territorial impacts?
- What future for EU cohesion policy?
- Relationship between TA and Cohesion Policy priorities to be strengthened – evidence needed to support territorial aspects (content)







Common challenge – team work needed

- Drafting team experts invited
- Evidence: crucial but limited
- EU wide team work: ESPON
 - new aspects to be considered in research
 - themes selected to support policy development
 - discussion forum
 - knowledge support based on long term European experience
- Open and inclusive discussion (OECD, CEMAT, EU neighbourhood)
